NHSC Regional Placement Advisor	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each NHSC Scholar transitioning from training to service will be assigned a Regional Placement Advisor (RPA). • Your RPA will guide and assist you in your search process, including generating lists of NHSC-approved sites that may be a good fit for you. • Your personal resource for understanding program terminology and connecting you with local partners. 	
NHSC Ambassador	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dedicated volunteers who offer to support prospective and current NHSC members. • May be able to provide information about what it's like to live or work in their state or community. • Has contacts at local sites that may have a job opening or connections to others in their community who work with the underserved. State Primary Care Office and Primary Care Association	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Every state has a Primary Care Office (PCO) and a Primary Care Association (PCA). • PCOs/PCAs know their states and may be able to give you information about specific sites that are looking to fill a vacancy immediately or in the near future. • Can describe what it is like to live or work in a local community and the general state of primary care in their area.
